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
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SNMA Highlights....

Dr. Allison Augustus-Wallace, Assistant Professor-Research in the Department of Medicine, is a LSU-Baton Rouge alum and doctoral graduate of LSU Health Sciences Center, School of Graduate Studies, Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology. She joins our office to be responsible for the coordination and implementation of current and future OCHME programs and operations, which involves data collection, compilation, analysis, and reporting related to institutional diversity metrics for medical education, graduate education and faculty, and planning as well as evaluation of programs, projects, and services. Additionally, she will coordinate and direct the Pre-Matriculation Program of the OCHME and assist in the development and implementation of diversity related medical education curriculum.

Our Prematriculation Program

In June, 2014 our office offered the annual Pre-matriculation program designed to facilitate the incoming first-year student's transition into medical school. The program provided mini-courses in the study of anatomy, cell biology, biochemistry, physiology, diagnostic reasoning and study skill development. Fourteen incoming L1 students participated in the three week session. We are very grateful for the efforts of the course faculty; Drs. Swartz, Gregory, Whitworth, Worthylake, Levitzky, McLean, Delcarpio, English, Chauvin, Rusnak, and DiCarlo. These dedicated faculty provided an invaluable year one preview for our new students.



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Summer Science...

The Summer Science Program was established by the LSUHSC OCMHE, to provide an opportunity for underrepresented minority and disadvantaged high school students interested in Health Sciences Professions to have a practical career development experience in an academic biomedical sciences environment.

In early summer of 2014, several SNMA members served as medical student coordinators for the annual summer science high school internship program. 24 high school students participated with host faculty mentors in the clinical and basic science divisions of the school of medicine and the school of nursing. The students were recognized this summer with a special proclamation from the *New Orleans City Council*.



Community Outreach...

Since 1985, the OCMHE has worked with the New Orleans Public Schools in an effort to increase students' knowledge of and interest in the sciences and particularly in the health professions. Throughout the year, area school students receive presentations on opportunities for health professions education, provided by LSUHSC faculty, staff, students and alumni.
