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## TEACHING EXPERIENCE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

# Course/Clerkship/Residency or Fellowship/CME Directorships

LSUHSC Anesthesiology Director of Regional Anesthesiology University Medical Center New Orleans Ochsner Medical Center Kenner

- As the director of regional anesthesia and acute pain division, I oversee the resident and medical student rotations in regional anesthesia as well as faculty development. I direct and implement curriculum for resident and medical school education, provide a large emphasis on teaching. Emphasis is placed on adhering to the educational curriculum, goals and objectives, didactics and clinical experience and the resident evaluation process. I am responsible for continuous review and revision of the regional anesthesia curriculum as appropriate and in response to input from faculty and the residency program director. I also perform routine review and evaluation of regional anesthesia faculty to meet ACGME requirements and clinical excellence. Under my direction, the program has received additional funding from Ochsner to expand resident funded FTE's from two to five residents in Q1 2019.
- I conduct dedicated weekly didactic teaching resident/medical student sessions which are protected from any perioperative responsibilities. Also, my didactic responsibilities extend to include Departmental Grand Rounds, Journal Clubs, Quality Assessment and Patient Safety Discussions, as well as the previously mentioned smaller settings with handouts during each rotation. Attendings, fellows, residents, CRNAs, and medical students are all part of these weekly conferences
- Additionally, I coordinate and sponsor a hands-on ultrasound workshops and a separate cadaver workshop with live models, simulated environments and a variety of needles and catheters with which to practice. Residents and attendings both attend these interactive events with a focused educational experience in regional anesthesia.
- Informally each day in the clinical arena, I discuss relevant literature to the bedside for discussion with the assigned case. I supplement the residents' self directed learning efforts with my own, fostering a culture of evidence based practice woven into daily bedside care.

#### **Curriculum Development/Implementation**

LSUHSC Anesthesiology Regional Anesthesia Resident Rotation Ochsner Medical Center Kenner

A required part of residency training in anesthesiology includes rotations in a regional anesthesia and acute pain. This rotation is designed to teach residents how to evaluate, diagnose, treat, and follow up with patients in consideration of regional

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anesthesia techniques. In January 2018, I designed and implemented the resident rotation in regional anesthesia at Ochsner Medical Center Kenner, and it was approved and funded by Ochsner in May 2018. Goals and objectives of the rotation in regional anesthesia are based on best practice guidelines and include teaching the resident to develop a thorough understanding of regional anesthesia and evaluate patient comorbidities that might influence anesthetic management. In addition, the resident learns how to review laboratory data, establish an anesthetic plan, interact with consultants, perform regional anesthesia procedures, review potential complications, and educate patients of the risks and benefits of different anesthetic techniques. The importance of evidence-based guidelines and improving patient satisfaction, safety, efficiency and effectiveness of healthcare is stressed during the rotation. My daily interaction with the residents in the clinic setting involves teaching of the goals and objections of the rotation as outlined above.

## **Creation of Enduring Teaching Materials**

#### **Formal Course Responsibilities**

LSUHSC Senior Surgery Elective

I am an annual lecturer in the senior surgery course elective offered to medical students at LSUHSC. In addition to delivering three lectures, I proctor a cadaver course in ultrasound anatomy and regional anesthesia.

Regional Anesthesia and Acute Pain Curriculum for resident and medical school education. Clinical and didactic teaching. Grand rounds, journal club, and lecture responsibilities.

As a faculty member of the LSUHSC Department of Anesthesiology, I present lectures and problem-based learning activities to residents and medical students annually as a part of the departmental resident lecture series. Typically, an afternoon of the lecture series involves a collaboration between an anesthesiology resident and myself to present pre-selected topics in lecture format followed by a problem-based learning session and a post-test to evaluate the efficacy of the teaching sessions and resident learning.

In addition to the formal resident lecture series, I am responsible for the teaching and training of anesthesiology residents in the pre-anesthesia evaluation, care of the surgical patient, critical care and obstetric patient management, pain management, ultrasound-guided central and peripheral venous access and difficult airway management (i.e. intubation using advanced airway techniques.) Teaching and training of residents occurs in all areas of the hospital and encompasses a wide variety of patients and levels of acuity. Areas of service conducive to resident teaching and training include the pre-anesthesia evaluation clinic, outpatient and inpatient surgery, labor and delivery, the intensive care unit and cardiac care unit, the post anesthesia care unit, interventional cardiology lab, the emergency room and the extended care/skilled care unit. In addition to

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resident teaching, I instruct student registered nurse anesthetists in anesthetic care of the surgical patient. My teaching responsibilities include instructing the anesthetist in preparing an anesthetic plan for the surgical patient, intraoperative airway management and intubation techniques, intraoperative anesthetic management and the immediate postoperative management of the surgical patient (i.e. pain management and special concerns during patient recovery from anesthesia.) My teaching responsibilities also involve teaching clinical skills such as airway management and ultrasound guided venous access to residents and fellows of other specialties, such as family medicine and pulmonary/critical care, in the intensive care unit.
