

Lung Cancer Patient Bill of Rights

- **1.** I have the right to receive a comprehensive cancer treatment plan, including:
 - Treatments for my cancer, including chemotherapy, targeted therapy, surgical and/or radiation treatments, as appropriate for me.
 - Therapies to help keep me comfortable before, during and after my cancer treatment.
 - Pain control.
 - Psychosocial care for myself and my loved ones.
 - Survivorship care planning.
- **2.** I have the right to molecular testing of my tumor tissue, if appropriate for me, to ensure I have the right care for my particular tumor.
- **3.** I have the right to be informed about any clinical trials that may be appropriate for me.
- **4.** I have the right to a second opinion if I feel it would enhance my care.
- **5.** I have the right to be treated with respect and dignity regardless of my smoking history.

- This year, more than 222,000 Americans will be diagnosed with lung cancer.
- Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related deaths in Americans among all ethnicities.
- Every year, lung cancer kills more people in the United States than breast, colon, prostate, liver and kidney cancers combined.

The Future Looks Much Brighter!

- Hundreds of clinical trials are underway, researching improved methods of preventing, detecting and treating lung cancer.
- The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved 5 new drugs for lung cancer in the past decade. With the clinical trials in process today, many more new treatments are on the horizon.
- Major advancements in surgical techniques and radiation therapy have also significantly improved lung cancer treatment options.
