TRANSPORTATION RESOURCES

Cancer is an expensive illness. Many of the people who contact Cancer Care each year cite financial need as a major source of difficulty. Some have no health insurance, some are insured but don't have coverage for parts of their treatment such as prescription drug co-pays, and many do not have extra income to meet new costs such as child care or transportation to treatment. People with cancer and their caregivers often have to cut back on time spent at work, which means their income decreases at the same time that their bills pile up.

CANCERCARE CAN HELP

CancerCare provides limited financial assistance for treatment-related transportation to people affected by cancer. As a nonprofit organization, funding depends on the sources of support we receive at any given time. If we do not currently have funding to assist you, our professional oncology social workers will always work to refer you to other financial assistance resources.

Eligibility

In order to be eligible for financial assistance you must:

- have a diagnosis of cancer confirmed by an oncology health care provider
- · be in active treatment for your cancer
- live in the U.S. or Puerto Rico
- meet our eligibility guidelines of 250% of the Federal Poverty Limit



The first step to applying for financial assistance is calling 800-813-HOPE (4673) and speaking with a Cancer*Care* social worker to complete a brief interview. We can be reached from 9 a.m.–7 p.m. (ET) Monday through Thursday, and 9 a.m.–5 p.m. (ET) on Friday.
