Fred A. Lopez, MD, FACP, is the Richard Vial Professor and Vice Chair of Education in the Department of Medicine and Assistant Dean for Student Affairs at the LSU School of Medicine. A native of New Orleans, Dr. Lopez received his undergraduate degree from Stanford University (CA) and his medical degree from the LSU School of Medicine in New Orleans, where he was a member of Alpha Omega Alpha and a graduate of the Honors Program. He pursued postgraduate medical training at Stanford University Medical Center where he was an intern, resident and chief resident in Internal Medicine and a fellow in Infectious Diseases under the tutelage of Drs. Kelley Skeff, Ted Harris, David Relman, and Victor Dzau. Board certified in both Infectious Diseases and Internal Medicine, he joined the faculty at LSU in 1998.
