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PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This conference is designed to help prepare the obstetrician/gynecologist for the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ABOG) certification examination Part I and to prepare the re-certifying physicians for the ABOG. It will provide a concise review of basic concepts in obstetrics and gynecology and the information pertinent to the diagnosis and treatment of conditions seen in everyday practice in the following areas: general gynecology, obstetrics, high-risk obstetrics, reproductive endocrinology, gynecologic oncology, women's primary health care, urogynecology, pelvic surgery, ultrasound review, infectious diseases, normal and abnormal pregnancy, and infertility.
