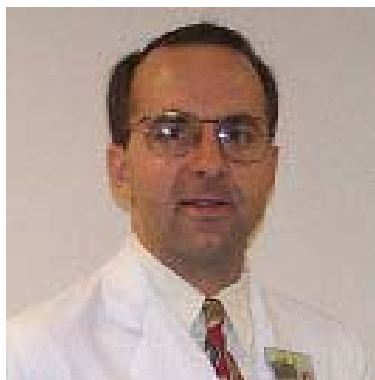

KUDOS FOR DR. VELEZ

Hematologist/Oncologist **Maria Velez, MD**, was named Vice-Chair of the Minority Affairs Committee for the Children’s Oncology Group, the NIH-sponsored national group that treats children with cancer. She also was honored with the Spirit Award of the American Cancer Society 2008 for her volunteer work with them and as Medical Director and Advisor of the SMILE program. This program connects first year medical students with cancer patients to develop a “buddy” relationship. The program is a collaboration of Children’s Hospital, LSU School of Medicine, and the American Cancer Society.

SIX PROFESSORSHIPS AWARDED

Six Pediatric faculty members were honored with professorships at an LSUHSC School of Medicine ceremony last June. **Dr. Diego H. Aviles** received the Alan Robson, MD Professorship of Pediatric Nephrology; **Dr. Brian Barkemeyer** received the Sheila B. Gottschalk, MD Professorship of Excellence in Teaching; **Dr. Oluwatoyin F. Bamgbola**, the Percy Rosenbaum, MD Professorship in Pediatric Nephrology; **Dr. Robin English**, the John Ey, MD Professorship in Hospitalist Pediatrics; **Dr. Suzanne Lefevre**, the

Pediatrics; and **Dr. Lolie Yu**, the Eugenie & Joseph Jones Family Foundation Professorship in Pediatric Cancer.

Altogether, 17 professorships were awarded at the ceremony. Pediatrics Chair **Dr. Ricardo Sorensen** said the Department is proud to have bestowed this honor on six of its faculty. He noted that divisions still without endowed professorships or chairs should consider looking for possibilities to establish new professorships. He explained that a professorship will be established with \$60,000, an amount that is matched by \$40,000 from the Board of Regents. If a division comes up with \$40,000, the department will contribute \$20,000 to complete the \$60,000 sum needed to apply for matching funds from the State. A chair requires \$600,000 but is obviously a much more attractive endowment, Sorensen said.

Dr. Uma Pisharody is the PI for a new \$73,902 per year grant award for the next two years from The Louisiana Vaccine Center/South Louisiana Institute for Infectious Disease Research Cooperative Pilot Research Grant Fund. Dr. Pisharody is working on a pilot translational project investigating the role that bacteria play in the etiology of necrotizing enterocolitis. She will use the grant money for lab supplies and support to get the project completed. Co-investigators are **Michael Ferris, Ph.D.** and **Duna Penn, M.D., M.S.** Their goal is to examine the role of intestinal bacteria in the pathogenesis of NEC using 16S rRNA gene-based molecular techniques.

"I am deeply indebted to Dr. Michael Ferris and Dr. Duna Penn for their support of my research," Dr. Pisharody said. "Without their mentorship, I could not have gotten this grant." She added: "I started this project as a fellow, under the guidance of the late **Dr. Schmidt-Sommerfeld**, whose teaching and guidance will never be forgotten. And I would like to thank all the physicians in the GI division for

helping me as their new junior faculty, supporting me as I attempt a career as a physician doing research." This was one of ten Pilot Research Grants awarded by the LVC/SLIIDR this month.

In other news involving the Division of Genetics, Dr. Lacassie and his colleagues were deeply saddened by the death of Aaron Frank Marcus on Saturday, July 19th after a brief illness. Marcus, 49, was the husband of **Karen Weissbecker Remer Marcus, PhD**, who has worked in the Neurofibromatosis Clinic since its inception in March 1994. Funeral services were held July 21st for Marcus, who was a partner in the law firm Lehmann Norman & Marcus LC.
