Caroline Straatmann, MD received her medical degree and completed her residency training at LSU Health New Orleans. She then completed her fellowship training in Pediatric Nephrology at LSU Health New Orleans. Dr. Straatmann serves as a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the Division of Nephrology at LSU Health New Orleans and is board-certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric nephrology by the American Board of Pediatrics. On why she chose her to specialize in Pediatric Nephrology, Dr. Straatmann said, "Because it provides the opportunity to care for patients, from newborns to young adults, with a wide range of interesting pathology, acuity and chronicity in both the inpatient and outpatient setting."
