**Julie Kaplow, PhD, ABPP**, is a licensed clinical psychologist, board certified in Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology. She founded the SAMHSA-funded Trauma and Grief (TAG) Center in 2012 while on faculty at the University of Michigan Medical School and brought the Center to Texas in 2014. As the Executive Director of the TAG Center at The Hackett Center for Mental Health, she develops, evaluates, and disseminates trauma- and bereavement-informed "best practices" to community providers in Greater Houston, across Texas and nationwide.

Dr. Kaplow received her BA in Psychology from the University of Michigan and her PhD in Clinical Psychology from Duke University. She completed her internship at Boston Children's Hospital/Harvard Medical School followed by specialized postdoctoral training in childhood trauma at the Center for Medical and Refugee Trauma at Boston Medical Center.

**Objectives:** At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Identify behavioral manifestations of trauma and grief in youth
2. Recognize three primary dimensions of grief according to multidimensional grief theory
3. Recognize markers of risk in patients that signal a need for trauma- or grief-focused therapy

**Intended audience:** This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.

RCR (required for NIH training grants) and DEI are important to discuss before embarking on any type of research, especially involving health disparities. Panel discussions will include how to incorporate RCR and DEI in 1) Research design: e.g., which populations will be studied to address health disparities/needs, 2) Methods: e.g., recruitment, consenting participants, evaluation tools, and data collection, 3) Results and Conclusions: e.g., interpretation of results; data analysis, 4) Communication/presentation of your results to the scientific community and the lay public.
