MEMORIAL SYMPOSIUM HONORS DR. EBERHARD SCHMIDT-SOMMERFELD

John Udall, MD, PhD, former head of LSUHSC Pediatric Gastroenterology and current Chair of Pediatrics at West Virginia School of Medicine gave a warm, often funny tribute to his LSU successor, the late Eberhard Schmidt-Sommerfeld, MD, at a symposium in his honor Oct. 31-Nov. 1 at the Astor Crown Plaza Hotel in New Orleans. Some 120 registrants heard worldclass presentations given by 19 former mentors, fellows, colleagues and friends of Dr. Schmidt-Sommerfeld, who died in November 2007. Speakers came from as far away at Jerusalem, Israel (Emanuel Lebenthal, MD, Director of the International Institute for Pediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition at Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center); Temuco, Chile (Eduardo Hebel, MD, Dean of the University de La Frontera); and Munich, Germany (Sybille Koletzko, MD (Dr. v. Haunersches Kinderspital of Ludwig Maximilians University). And, of course, our own faculty paid tribute: Ricardo Sorensen, MD; Randall Craver, MD; Bonny Dickinson, PhD; Paul Hyman, MD; and Uma Pisharody, MD.

JEFFREY MODELL CME COURSE A SUCCESS! Alan Knutsen, MD, and John Routes, MD, were

among the out-of-town speakers at the Third Annual Jeffrey Modell CME Course for the

General Practitioner, held November 21st at the Astor to explore the pulmonary manifestations of primary immunodeficiency diseases in children and adults. Dr. Knutsen is Professor and Director of Pediatric Alleray & Immunology at Saint Louis University, and Dr. Routes is Professor of Pediatrics, Medicine, Microbiology and Molecular Genetics at Children's Hospital of Wisconsin and Medical College of Wisconsin. The meeting brought together Steve Nelson, MD, Dean of the LSUHSC School of Medicine (who gave the introductory talk about lung immunity mechanisms), and Vicki and Fred Modell, co-founders of the Jeffrey Modell Foundation. LSU and the Modell Foundation work together to increase will primary immunodeficiency-related activities, to include research and diagnostic capabilities, in New Orleans and in Louisiana. Because of the success of the Course, a fourth meeting will be held in November 2009, dedicated to exploring the gastrointestinal manifestations of primary immunodeficiency diseases, said Ricardo Sorensen, MD, Chairman of the LSUHSC Department of Pediatrics.
