
RESULTS

FROM THE PRE-RELEASE MEDICAID ENROLLMENT PROGRAM EVALUATION

WHAT IS THIS PROGRAM?

- In 2016, Louisiana expanded Medicaid. Now more people can get health care through Medicaid than before.
- In 2017, the Louisiana Department of Corrections (DOC) and Department of Health worked together to make a new program that:
 - Helps people sign up for Medicaid before they get out of prison if they want it.
 - Gives people with more health needs a case manager from their Medicaid insurance company before they get out. A case manager can help someone getting out of prison make appointments, get medication, and help with other health-related concerns.



WHAT WE WANTED TO KNOW

- 1. Did the Pre-release Medicaid Enrollment Program work?
- 2. How many people got Medicaid benefits after prison because of the Program?
- 3. What parts of the Program worked well?
- 4. What parts of the Program do not work as well?
- 5. How can we make the parts that did not work well better?

WHAT WE DID

- 1. We used Medicaid information to compare how many people had Medicaid when they got out of prison before and after the Program started.
- 2. We did focus groups with formerly incarcerated people to learn about their experiences with the Program and with Medicaid.
- 3. We did interviews with DOC staff and case managers who carry out the Program.

WHAT WE FOUND OUT

- ☑ The Program works
 - More people had Medicaid when they got out of prison after the Program started than before.
- ✓ People like case management
 - o Most people did not have a case manager, but the people who did said they liked the extra help.
 - More people might need case management than we thought.
 - Doing case management with video conferences into the prisons instead of by phone might help build trust between Program participants and case managers.

WHAT DIDN'T WORK SO WELL

- □ A lot of people lost Medicaid after they got out because
 - They had old contact information so Medicaid staff could not reach them to make sure they were still eligible.
 - They did not have a working phone number.
- Some people did not get to apply for Medicaid or finish case management before they got out because
 - They got out early because they made parole or got good time.
 - o They could not get into a pre-release class.
- □ Did not know they were being offered Medicaid for free because
 - The Program was not explained to them.
 - They got a lot of other information at the same time.

WHAT COULD MAKE THE PROGRAM BETTER FOR PARTICIPANTS

- Find new ways to contact people after they get out so they do not lose their Medicaid.
- Start the application and case management earlier.
- Add video meetings or make in-person visits in prison an option for case management.
- Make sure people get into case management who need it by
 - Adding to the list of health concerns and conditions that qualify a person for case management.
 - o Making solid guidelines and rules for DOC staff to follow to figure out who needs case management.
