MED 300 Student Expectations

Basic Objectives from Goals

- I. History and Physical Exam
- II. Problem List: Based upon the information gathered from the patient, you must learn to define as clearly as possible the problems identified for that patient.
- III. Differential Diagnosis: From the problem list, you must be able to develop a complete differential diagnosis, appropriate to the active problems.
- IV. Plans for Management: diagnostic measure, therapeutic measures, patient education.
- V. Documentation: H&P, progress notes, procedure notes
- VI. Self Education

Wards and Consult Services Expectations

- A student will make work rounds each day with team house officers.
- Attending faculty will make teaching rounds with the students daily.
- Your patient assessment/ progress notes should be completed prior to rounds.
- During any rounding session, the student is expected:
 - o to be able to present the patient's case
 - o to be aware of pertinent lab or other test results (radiology, etc)
 - o to know the patient's current medications and their side effects, and
 - o to have a basic grasp of the overall diagnostic and therapeutic plans for his/her patient.

Wards Specific Expectations

- Team consists of a resident and intern(s) in addition to a faculty member.
- Call will occur every 4th night.
 - o Overnight call is NOT required; call will not exceed 11PM.
 - o Call is not optional.
 - Missed calls cannot be made up.
 - Discuss with your team when to show up post-call.
- It is anticipated that you will admit 1-3 patients per call night.
- You will be responsible for doing histories and physicals on all assigned patients.
- You will follow these patients daily, writing progress notes in the SOAP format, documenting patients' care.
- Presentation of patients on rounds.

Consult Specific Expectations

- There is no scheduled call duty during the Consults rotation.
- Weekend duty is specific to the rotation.
- Attend Morning/Noon Report at respective sites
- Student responsibilities include:
 - o H & P's done under supervision of house officers.

- o Attend team-based subspecialty clinics when they occur.
- o Presentation of patients to attending faculty.
- Rounds with attending faculty and house officers.
- o There is no scheduled call duty during the Consults rotation.
- Weekend duty is specific to the rotation.
- Attend Morning/Noon Report at respective sites

Clinics Expectations

- Students will spend two weeks attending the various clinics
- Please review the Clinics schedule to ensure that you know where you will be on each day.
- Check your email and the student curriculum website regularly because the clinic schedule is prone to change.
- New Orleans clinic students attend noon report at UMCNO in person Monday through Thursday if clinics are scheduled on LSUHSC or UMC campus, and Grand Rounds on Friday at noon.
- No evaluations; clinic card is record of attendance and basis of grade for the rotation.
- No on-call duty.
- If you must be late, notify your clinic preceptor and Kelly Rauser as soon as possible.

Expectations for all Rotations

- 1. Attend lecture series and Medicine Grand Rounds.
- 2. Report any concerns to the directors.
- 3. Complete nutrition and ethics modules.
- 4. Request evaluations for consults and wards for each faculty member with whom you spend three or more days on a rotation.
- 5. Complete End of Block clerkship evaluation.
- 6. NBME Final Exam.
- 7. Request all absences before the block begins. Notify your team and the clerkship office (coordinator or director) of any emergent absences (illness, etc).
- 8. Wear appropriate attire- professional clothing during working hours.
