
The following LSU Department of Medicine faculty were recognized by Inside New Orleans' "Leading Doctors 2026" in the current issue of the magazine -

The OmniaSecure is a defibrillator lead that detects and relays abnormal heart rhythms to an implantable cardioverter defibrillator (ICD) or cardiac resynchronization therapy defibrillator (CRT-D) and is a critical component of the system in delivering prompt and appropriate care.
