<u>Dr. Ben Springgate</u> (Community and Population Medicine) on Thursday, July 11, gave a talk to the Louisiana HOPE Council entitled "Kratom - A Primer," at the invitation of the Louisiana Department of Health. Kratom is a plant-derived substance which is commonly sold in tobacco shops, and which will be banned in Louisiana effective August 1, 2025, as the result of a recently signed state law. There are no FDA approved uses of Kratom, and the ingestion of Kratom has been associated with a wide array or adverse effects, including dependence, liver injury, seizures, and death.
