Dr. Juzar Ali, Klein Professor of Medicine at LSUHSC is an academic clinician, clinical educator and researcher in the section of Pulmonary Critical Care at LSU Health Sciences Center (LSUHSC), New Orleans and has also worked in health and hospital administration at MCLNO and ILH as CMO & CEO through his tenure with LSU since 1991. He is currently attached as Professor Emeritus and Consultant Director of the TB-NTM – Bronchiectasis Pulmonary Disease program in the section of Pulmonary /CC/A&I with the School of Medicine.

He has practice experience in Pakistan, India, Kenya, Unites States and Turkey and has worked nationally and internationally in the field of tuberculosis. He has developed programs that contribute to the education of medical students, trainees, allied health professionals, and the community. His clinical, academic, and research interests include the diagnosis and management of tuberculous and non-tuberculous mycobacterial disease and related co-morbidities in pulmonary medicine specially Bronchiectasis. He has participated in various multicenter clinical studies and trials of tuberculosis and Non-TB Mycobacteria and Bronchiectasis and has co-authored a textbook, Pulmonary Pathophysiology, a symptom-based clinical and pathophysiologic review of lung diseases. He has also published a Chest Radiology PRE-TEST series for medical students and residents. A CDC TB Champion, Dr. Ali is a recipient of numerous teaching awards at LSUHSC, School of Medicine over the last two decades including multiple Aesculapian awards and the University Copping award. He has also received the Spirit of Charity Award in 2022. This award is for his academic, patient care, research, teaching and administrative services in the Charity Hospital system over the last 40 years. He has served as a Governor's appointee on the State Nursing Board and is currently serving as the LSU representative on the State Board of Medical Examiners. He has been consistently recognized as a member of the Best Doctors in America, and is a Fulbright Scholar Teaching Grant and Alumni awardee and Fulbright Senior Scholar Awardee twice with academic tenures in Turkey and India. He has also been a Visiting Faculty to Vietnam under the US-Vietnam Education Fund Program funded by US Congress. Recently his focus has been on developing a Mycobacterial Diseases Mentoring, Training & Research program in the section at LSU and creating a NTM-Bronchiectasis /Mycobacterial diseases patient care /clinical and cell bank repository/registry and data base in collaboration with other basic science departments at LSUHSC, national and regional centers including NIAID. He continues in this consultative capacity with his TB-NTM-BE program team and with the Office of Public Health TB program Region 1 & 2.
