AMA Funds LSU Standardized Patient Project

The LSU Health New Orleans SOM Standardized Patient Project led by <u>Dr. Peter DeBlieux</u> (Emergency Medicine) and Dr. Rachel Fiore partnered with UNO Department of Computer Science Associate Professor Ben Samuel and Loren Larsen, CEO of Videra Health an AI leader in patient communications, <u>Dr. Seth Vignes</u> (Hospital Medicine), <u>Dr. Jordan Vaughn</u> (Emergency Medicine) and our Trauma Informed Psychology experts Dr. Erika Rajo and Dr. Sandy Hyatt to propose an educational model utilizing AI generated patients and AI coaches to enhance student and resident communication skills. This proposal, titled Compassion in Motion: Training Tailored Communication Across the Clinical Continuum, has been selected for funding through the AMA ChangeMedEd® Transforming Lifelong Learning Through Precision Education Grant Program. The AMA received nearly 200 letters of intent and had 30 finalists covering a broad range of institutions, learners and projects.
