David Swetland, MD, MEd, is board-certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Pulmonology. Dr. Swetland earned his medical degree from LSUHSC New Orleans. He completed his Pediatric residency training also at LSUHSCNO, and, following a year as Chief Resident, furthered his training with a fellowship in pediatric pulmonology and Master of Education degree at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center in Ohio. Dr. Swetland returned to New Orleans in 2021 as Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Tulane University School of Medicine. He serves as the Medical Director of the Ventilator Assisted Care Program at Manning Family Children's and is the Pediatric Program Associate Director at the Tulane University Cystic Fibrosis Center.
