Charles Hemenway, MD, PhD, is the Service Line Chief for the CHNOLA Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders. A graduate of Middlebury College and the University of Massachusetts Chan Medical School, he completed his residency in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at University of Florida/Shands Hospital and his fellowship in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology at Duke University Medical Center. He also earned his PhD in Genetics from Duke University. Dr. Hemenway served on the faculty at Tulane University until 2007, when he became a Professor of Pediatrics at Stritch School of Medicine, Loyola University Chicago. Dr. Hemenway returned to New Orleans in 2022, and currently serves on the LSUHSC New Orleans faculty as a Professor of Clinical Pediatrics and the Jeffrey Modell Professor of Pediatric Primary Immunodeficiency Diseases.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Recognize that discovery often results from chance.
2. Appreciate that four drugs, developed from 1950-1970, remain the backbone of therapy for childhood acute lymphoblastic leukemia.
3. Reinforce the idea that change, even for the better, is often difficult.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
