Craig Conard, MD, MPH, FAAP received his undergraduate degree in Spanish from Hamilton College in Clinton, NY, his Master's of Public Health in international health from the Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine. He earned his medical degree from the Tulane University School of Medicine and completed his pediatric internship and residency at Ohio State University/Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, OH. Dr. Conard has extensive global health experience in Latin America and eastern Africa, specifically in Rwanda, where he has served as a Senior Pediatrician for Human Resources for Health since 2015. Dr. Conard returned to New Orleans in 2018 and is the Section Chief for Tulane Hospitalists at Children's Hospital New Orleans. He has expertise in pediatrics, global health and nutrition, and is board certified in pediatrics.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Understand that Global Health is Local Health
- Describe how the aftermath of the 1994 Rwandan genocide set up Rwanda for public health failures and eventual success.
- Identify how a multifactorial, comprehensive approach to medical education can produce results in a developing country setting.
