National Youth HIV & AIDS Awareness Day (NYHAAD), annually on April 10th, is a day to educate the public about the impact of HIV and AIDS on young people. The day also highlights the HIV prevention, treatment, and campaigns young people the of in The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that in 2020, young people aged 13-24 accounted for 20% of all new HIV diagnoses in the United States. Young people living with HIV are the least likely of any age group to be retained in care and have

a suppressed viral load. Addressing the impact of HIV on young people requires they have access to affirming, culturally competent, and medically accurate resources and tools.

Ashleah Courtney, MD, MSPH, FAAP, is a third-year Pediatric Infectious Disease fellow at Tulane University School of Medicine. Dr. Courtney earned a Bachelor of Science in Biology at Henderson State University. She then completed a Master of Science in Public Health with a concentration in Parasitology/Tropical Medicine.

Dr. Courtney returned to Arkansas for medical school, earning her medical degree from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. She then competed her pediatric residency at Arkansas Children's. Dr. Courtney began her Pediatric Infectious Disease fellowship in 2020.

Dr. Courtney's research interest focuses on the creation and assessment of clinical decision support system tools within the electronic medical record to optimize antimicrobial prescribing.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Discuss why acute upper respiratory tract infections (AURI) should be a focus of outpatient antimicrobial stewardship interventions
- Examine the impact of non-first-line prescribing in AURI
- Identify unique interventions to improve first-line prescribing for AURI
- Compare patient and clinic differences in first-line prescribing in AURI

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
