11th Annual Quality Improvement & Patient Safety Forum



The 11th Annual LSU Quality Improvement (QI) and Patient Safety Forum was held last Thursday, June 8, 2023. There were 10 oral presentations and 30 poster presentations given by medical students and house officers representing New Orleans, Lafayette, and Baton Rouge based training programs. LSU Peds represented 23% of submissions. 3 oral presentations, 6 posters, and 2 abstracts. Click here to view the full list.

After over a decade of advocacy from the American Academy of Pediatrics, <u>applications are now open</u> for the first awards from the **Pediatric Subspecialty Loan Repayment Program**. Pediatric medical subspecialists and pediatric surgical specialists are eligible to apply for \$100,000 in loan repayment. **The deadline to apply is July 20**.

Awardees must commit to serving an underserved area for three years. The program is available for both fellowship trainees and those who have completed fellowship. The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) will fund 150 awardees this year.

Dr. Diana Montoya-Williams is an attending neonatologist in the division of Neonatology at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and the Hospital for the University of Pennsylvania. She is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the University of Pennsylvania's Perelman School of Medicine and a principal investigator in CHOP's PolicyLab and Penn's Leonard Davis Institute of Health Economics. Dr. Montoya-Williams is an NIH-funded physician scientist who studies inequities in maternal and infant health outcomes that occur by race, ethnicity, nativity and preferred language, including a focus on immigration policies as determinants of perinatal health. She also has a special interest in promoting anti-racism efforts in medicine.
