
LSU Peds at COMSEP

Interested in Promotion?

The process for faculty interested in academic promotion for the upcoming cycle (effective July 2026) is underway. The Dean's Office has requested that all faculty who intend to seek promotion this cycle declare their intent soon. Please inform Dr. Brian Barkemeyer, Pediatric Promotions Committee Chair, at <u>bbarke@lsuhsc.edu</u> of your intentions by April 7, 2025.

Typically, most faculty have been in their current rank for at least 6 to 7 years by the time of their promotion effective date (i.e., in current rank at least since 2019-20 for those intending to seek promotion this cycle). Rarely, a candidate's accomplishments may allow for promotion on a shorter interval. Please be on the lookout for promotion workshops from the Dean's Office in the near future. The promotions process requires timely adherence to promotion guidelines and packet preparation. Packet preparation requires time and involves extensive administrative support from Kelly Allerton.

Dr. Thomas R. Kimball serves as the Chief of Pediatric Cardiology and Nelson K. Ordway Professor of Pediatrics at the Department of Pediatrics, Louisiana State University Health New Orleans. A tenured Professor of Pediatrics, he is also the Co-Director of the Heart Center at Manning Family Children's of New Orleans.

Dr. Kimball earned his medical degree from New York University and completed his pediatrics residency training at UCLA. He furthered his training in Pediatric Cardiology at Cincinnati Children's Hospital. He ultimately served as an attending physician at Cincinnati Children's for over 30 years. In May 2019, Dr. Kimball joined the faculty of the Department of Pediatrics at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center.

Throughout his career, Dr. Kimball has secured over 10 million dollars in grant funding for various research initiatives. His dedication to advancing the field of pediatric cardiology through clinical, educational, and research contributions, as well as his leadership in training the next generation of pediatric cardiologists, has significantly impacted both the academic and medical communities.


