Dr. Alexis Thompson is the Hematology Division Chief at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and holds the Elias Schwartz MD Endowed Chair in Hematology. She is also Professor of Pediatrics at the University of

Pennsylvania Perelman School of Medicine. Her clinical interests include hemoglobinopathies (thalassemia and sickle cell disease), and stem cell transplantation, including gene therapy. Her most significant scientific contributions are clinical and translation studies to better understand and treat hemoglobinopathies. She has served on regional and national advisory committees for governmental agencies as well as nonprofit organizations focused on improving healthcare access and reducing health disparities. As a leader of the American Society of Hematology (ASH), including ASH President in 2018, Dr. Thompson helped to develop a national sickle cell data collection platform and to implement newborn screening and early intervention efforts in sub-Saharan Africa, where the burden of SCD is profound. Dr. Thompson received the ASH Award for Leadership in Promoting Diversity in 2023 and was elected to the National Academy of Medicine in 2024.
