Dr. Kimiyo Harris-Williams Establishes High School Research Cohort

The students explored the world of biomedical research from the unique perspective of the NIH All of Us Research Program, while learning the steps and utilizing the scientific method.

The New Orleans Charter Science and Mathematics High School students, with




guidance from Dr. Harris-Williams and their Science teacher, Ms. Damionne Bell, developed a scientific question based on the data available on the public tier of the All of Us Researcher Workbench. They formulated a research question, hypothesis, conducted a research project, wrote an abstract and presented their poster presentations.

The presentation judges included Chairman Dr. Dedrick Moulton, Vice-Chair Dr. Bonnie Desselle, and Dr. Monique Cola, Head of School at the New Orleans Charter Science and Mathematics High School.

Dr. Tamara Bradford is board-certified in both pediatrics and pediatric cardiology and joined the team at Children's Hospital New Orleans as Medical Director of the soon to be established Heart Failure,

Heart Transplantation, and Mechanical Circulatory Support program. She received her medical degree from Texas A&M University College of Medicine and completed her pediatrics residency training at Vanderbilt Children's Hospital in Nashville, Tennessee. She then transitioned to Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center where she completed her categorical pediatric cardiology fellowship. Dr. Bradford pursued an advanced 4th-year cardiology fellowship in pediatric heart failure, cardiomyopathy, and heart transplantation, also at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. After completing training, Dr. Bradford moved to Little Rock, Arkansas where she spent the first five years of her career as an attending transplant cardiologist at Arkansas Children's Hospital. She has authored several peer-reviewed publications and has expertise regarding the evaluation and management of patients with heart failure and heart transplantation, as well as specific training in mechanical circulatory support devices.

- Identify and explain the key features and pathophysiology of primary heart failure in pediatrics
- Describe current advances in pharmacological and nonpharmacological therapies in pediatric heart failure
- Understand emerging therapies and future directions in pediatric heart failure
