TEACHING EXPERIENCE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Curriculum Development

Group Supervision of Supervision (2021 to present, 2 hours per week; year-long)

Collaboratively developed a formal, structured supervision of supervision experience for six psychology intern trainees and 2 psychology postdoctoral trainees to develop their competency in clinical supervision.

Creation of Enduring Teaching Materials

Motivational Interviewing for Health Services Professionals

Collaboratively created an interactive lecture to train mental health professionals on the utilization of motivational interviewing in the healthcare setting. These training materials focused on interviewing with populations struggling with substance use and/or those who are victims of violence. Videos, role plays, and knowledge checks were used to increase understanding and retention. This didactic has been used by other clinicians as a teaching tool for psychology interns.

Neuropsychological Assessment (30 hours, 1 year, 2018)

Teaching Assistant for Grace Mucci, Ph.D., M.S., ABPdN in the Psychology Department at the American School of Professional Psychology. Assisted in curriculum development, academic support, and evaluation of 10 doctoral level students. This course introduced the assessment of brain-behavior relationships and neuropsychology including major cognitive domains and brain structures associated with psychological function and dysfunction.

Trauma-Informed Care for Medical Providers (2 hours, 4/1/2022)

Co-led a team-based learning course for 200 medical students at LSUHSC School of Medicine. Course introduced learners to the impact of trauma and pathways to recovery on an individual and systemic level, as well as the basic principles of trauma-informed care and culturally sensitive clinical practices.

University/Institutional Service: Departmental committees

2020-present **Committee for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging** Within the Department of Psychiatry at LSUSHC, the Committee for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging (CDEIB) represents the sections of Psychology and Social Work in the Department of Psychiatry. This committee was initially formed in 2017 to ensure that the section of Psychology was thoroughly addressing diversity through our training program and faculty development. This initial mission has expanded to help identify and eliminate barriers to cultural inclusivity in the broader department of psychiatry. When serving as co-chair of this group, I aided in the committee's mission by developing and participating in several initiatives including hosting a monthly book club to expand cultural awareness and racial equity, creating an anonymous online feedback portal, developing a monthly newsletter highlighting cultural news around the country, and organizing a yearly survey of the cultural and inclusivity of the sections of psychology and social work.

2021-present Clinical Psychology Internship Committee

Within the Department of Psychiatry at LSUSHC, the section of Psychology has a Clinical Psychology Internship Committee that meets monthly to discuss the quality of internship program, implement any necessary changes to the training program, review selection criteria of applicants to invite for interviews and determine selection of applicants to rank for positions. As a member of this committee, I discuss individual interns' progress and contribute to the internship program's continued growth.

2023-present Consultation Liaison Fellowship Committee

Within the Department of Psychiatry, assist with the training program for psychiatry residents completing a fellowship on the consultation liaison team at University Medical Center. Committee members assist with interviewing applicants, provide trainings, offer consultation, and support research efforts of psychiatry fellows.

At University Medical Center, a team of mental health clinicians provide Psychological First Aid to community members who have experienced trauma related to a mass casualty incident. As a member of this team, I volunteer to provide these psychological supportive interventions as needed.

At University Medical Center, hospital administration and select clinical attendings are working with the Schwartz Center to develop a Stress First Aid program for the hospital. This program will be implemented hospital-wide to support all healthcare professionals and reduce stress injuries associated with occupational responsibilities. As the lead of the Trainer team I will support the implementation of the Stress First Aid program by training others within our organization.

Special Assignments

2020-2021 Virtual Psychological First Aid

Within LCMC hospitals, a group of mental health clinicals from LSUHSC's section of psychology developed a virtual program for the delivery of Psychological First Aid to healthcare personnel in the wake of COVID-19. As a member of this team, I helped organize and implement PFA to healthcare workers throughout the hospital system.

At University Medical Center, provided individual psychological first aid to Emergency Department staff and employees impacted by work-related trauma.

Clinical Service:

In-patient service activities

2021-present University Medical Center; 12 hr/week

Primary responsibilities include inpatient screening with patients hospitalized for traumatic injuries to assess for symptoms of PTSD, depression, and substance use. Brief therapeutic intervention is provided to patients and family members. I also help facilitate a biweekly survivor support group. I also provide client-centered and consultee-centered case consultation to interdisciplinary teams.

Clinic coverage

2021-present **University Medical Center Trauma Recovery Clinic; 7 hr/week** Provide trauma-specific and informed psychotherapy to adolescent and adult trauma survivors. Faciliate bi-monthly support groups for trauma-survivors and their loved ones. I also participate in weekly multidisciplinary treatment team meetings aimed at carecoordination and program development.

2021-present **University Medical Center Behavioral Health Clinic; 20 hr/week** Primary responsibilities include outpatient psychotherapy and co-facilitation of an outpatient psychotherapy process group. I also co-facilitate an Intensive Outpatient program for individuals with either psychosis or anxiety/depression. As a member of the IOP team, I coordinate care and participate in interdisciplinary team meetings with psychiatrists, psychologists, and social workers.

2021-present **LSUHSC Behavioral Sciences Center**; 5 hr/per week Provided supervision for psychology interns who are providing direct services to trauma survivors seeking inpatient medical care at University Medical Center. I also provide weekly supervision of psychology interns and postdoctoral fellows who supervise other less experienced mental health trainees conducting psychotherapy and psychological assessment services.

Community Service Activities:

2021 Psychological First Aid for Chaplain Residency

Provided drop-in hours for chaplain residents struggling with job related stressors and vicarious trauma. PFA was used to support resilience of these trainees following traumatic events and challenging patient interactions that transpired while working in a Level 1 trauma center.

2021-present National Trauma Survivors Day (annual event)

In collaboration with the Trauma Survivors Network, co-host an annual community event honoring trauma survivors and their loved ones at University Medical Center.

4/9/22 Community Health Fair at University Medical Center; 5hr

Provided general information about mental health services available to the community as well as psychoeducation on mental health and adaptive psychological coping. This event was open to any member of the public.

4/25/22 Mindfulness Workshop for Healthcare Personnel; 2hr

Volunteered for a workshop for healthcare personnel at University Medical Center. At this event, I provided psychoeducation on mindfulness techniques that can be easily implemented into the workday to manage occupational stress.
