Human Behavior and Development – Virtual Learning Curriculum

- During the COVID pandemic, restructured the curriculum for the HBD course three times to meet the demands of the restrictions on campus for teaching activities.
- In Spring 2020, transitioned from a 100% active learning model to 100% lectures over Zoom.
- By Fall 2021, the course transitioned back to more active learning by conducting three TBL sessions, two peer instruction and case discussion sessions and three lectures followed by case discussion all conducted over Zoom.
- As course director, I was responsible for instructing facilitators in how to manage the virtual learning room.

2014

Children’s Mental Health Workshops

- Created materials to be used as a series of workshops for children in St. Bernard parish to address social-emotional difficulties, build resilience and encourage community engagement.
- Each workshop provided psychoeducation, experiential activity and large group discussion.
- A colleague in the department used the materials with another group of children in Plaquemines parish.

2021 - 2024

Collaborative Social Justice Book Club

- In collaboration with University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center Psychology Internship Training Director, we created a virtual book club to bring our two psychology internship programs together six times over the course of the year to discuss a shared book related to social justice.
- We created an outline for the sessions and developed discussion questions.
- 18 interns participated in the book club as part of internship.
- Curriculum was presented at a national conference and shared with other training programs.

2021 - Present

Tiger Bites Podcast

- In collaboration with the CME office, I assisted in the creation of a series of podcasts where we interview faculty and bring information about the functions of the medical school and professional development topics to the SOM community.
- Faculty can earn CME credit after listening to the podcasts which are available on the LSUHSC website.
- There are 32 completed podcasts as of 2026 over three seasons.
