







Sharon Anderson ('79) named Dean of the Oregon Health and Science University School of Medicine

Sharon Anderson ('79) has been named Dean of the Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU) School of Medicine, following a national search. Dr. Anderson, a nationally accomplished clinician and educator, will be overseeing nearly 2,500 faculty representing 19 clinical departments, 7 basic science departments, and multiple research centers and institutes.

After earning her B.A. from the University of Maryland and her MD from Louisiana State University Medical Center, Dr. Anderson completed her internal medicine residency training at OHSU, her clinical fellowship in nephrology at Beth Israel Hospital, and her nephrology research fellowship at Brigham and Women's Hospital, an affiliate of Harvard Medical School. After several years on faculty there, she joined the faculty at OHSU and the VA Portland Health Care System in 1991.

The Interprofessional Student Alliance (IPSA)

The Interprofessional Student Alliance (IPSA) is a student-run, idea "incubator" that functions to develop leaders through interprofessional workshops and student-created service projects. These are interprofessional in that students from all six LSU Health Sciences Center professional schools are involved. These students volunteer to staff and run all IPSA service projects, which include Cooking Matters, Diabetes Internal Medicine Clinic, NOLA Hotspotting, New Orleans Adolescent Health Project, New Orleans Medical Innovators, New Orleans Women and Children's Shelter Outreach Program, Sensory Funday, and SMART Cafe. - Student Research Externship funded by LAFP for students wishing to do clinical family medicine research
- Nutrition elective offered for the first time Fall Semester 2016
- Elective Dermatology Workshop offered by family medicine faculty from all four residency training programs, to 30 medical students and 30 physician assistants
- Assignment of FM faculty to participate as House Faculty in teaching L1-L2 Clinical Skills House Faculty
- Expansion of an L2 elective in longitudinal care management program for adult diabetics to include teens with obesity and prediabetes
- Participation of FM faculty as Lecturers in new Population Health course as lecturers on Systems of Care and Global Health
- Participation by family medicine residents in teaching small groups of students their physical diagnosis skills
- Resident and faculty participation in Student-run Homeless Clinic
- Resident participation in Bridge House twice a month

Faculty News

Dr. Fred Rodriguez ('75) received the 2017 Ward Burdick Award for Distinguished Service to Pathology. This award is given annually by the Board of Directors of the American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP) to honor and recognize members who have made significant contributions to pathology through sustained service to the profession. Dr. Burdick was one of the founding members of the ASCP in 1922. Fred was honored at the ASCP Annual Meeting in Chicago in September, 2017.

Lafayette Family Medicine New Program Director—Dr. Marilyn Marshall is the new Program Director for the Family Medicine Program in Lafayette. She attended medical school at the University of Michigan and trained at the UASMS South Arkansas Family Medicine Residency Program. Prior to Dr. Marshall's arrival to University Hospital and Clinics, she was on faculty at the South Arkansas Family Medicine Program where she was an Assistant Professor and the Program Director. When she moved to Louisiana, she became the Site Director for the Abbeville Community Health Center where she spent 14 years serving the members of that community. While in Abbeville, she became a preceptor for the Department of Family Medicine at University Hospital and Clinics and it was through this relationship that Dr. Marshall felt she could be a member of this team. Her clinical interests are in obesity and women's health.



Update on the School's Accreditation by the LCME

he School of Medicine is due for reaccreditation by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) this fall. Our last site visit was in 2009 and we were reaccredited for the maximum term of 8 years. We have completed our institutional self-study, and submitted all of the documents in August. This involved more than 20 months of work, starting with an extensive independent student analysis. The students did their initial survey in the spring of 2016 and presented recommendations to the School in the summer of 2016. The School made many changes and improvements in response to their suggestions. Then the students did a follow-up survey in the spring of 2017 based on our response to their initial recommendations. There was 88-95% satisfaction with the School's response to their recommendations, so this student study is a good example of ongoing quality improvement!

The final documents also included a 360 page database (DCI), organized around 12 accreditation standards and 93 sub-standards (elements). The appendix of supporting documents to the DCI was nearly 2,000 pages. Finally, the Self-Study Task Force completed a 35-page summary report that includes a list of our institutional strengths. While we have many strengths, we chose to highlight our stable leadership through challenging times, the success of the private-public partnerships, the growth of our clinical revenue, our continued commitment to education and investment in new facilities and personnel in the curriculum and student affairs offices, the success of curriculum renewal, our students and their engagement in ongoing quality improvement, the Houses program, our support for scholarship and research, the Rural Scholars program, and our new emphasis on interprofessional education. Clearly the faculty have been busy and we have much to be proud of.

The entire self-study process involved an enormous amount of work by over 250 people: 155 faculty, 60 medical students, 16 residents, 9 non-faculty staff, 3 non-faculty alumni, and 8 representatives from our clinical partners. They all deserve our thanks for an excellent self-study. Now comes the challenge of preparing for the site visit itself. We will have a mock site visit on October 8 – 10 to fine tune our preparations. The 5-member LCME site visit team will be here on November 12-15, after having 3 months to review our self-study reports. They will meet with the Dean, the Dean's staff, department heads, course and clerkship directors, faculty, students, residents and hospital leaders. Two members of the team will spend a half-day at the campus in Baton Rouge. We will receive preliminary findings just prior to the team's departure on November 15th, but we will not receive the LCME's final report until February 2018 at the earliest.
