Her research over the past 20 years focused on health promotion for vulnerable, underserved women in Southeast Louisiana and the greater New Orleans community. She is a co-investigator in a study to assess a rural community’s needs for perinatal mental health and evaluating early pregnancy intervention. This study provides a foundation on which to study the introduction of early physical monitoring interventions that have potential to improve perinatal outcomes among African American women.
