SPECIALTY OF SURGERY (GENERAL SURGERY) DEFINED

May be defined in a comprehensive but still specific manner as follows:

- 1. A CENTRAL CORE OF KNOWLEDGE OF, AND SKILLS COMMON TO, ALL SURGICAL SPECIALTIES: viz., anatomy, physiology, metabolism, pathology, wound healing, shock and resuscitation, neoplasia and nutrition.
- 2. THE DIAGNOSIS, PRE-OPERATIVE, OPERATIVE, AND POST-OPERATIVE CARE, INCLUDING THAT PROVIDED IN THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT AND THE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT, OF PATIENTS WITH DISEASE OF THE FOLLOWING PRIMARY COMPONENTS:
 - A. THE ALIMENTARY TRACT
 - B. THE ABDOMEN AND ITS CONTENTS
 - C. THE BREAST
 - D. THE HEAD AND NECK
- E. THE VASCULAR SYSTEM, excluding the intracranial vessels, the heart and those vessels intrinsic and immediately adjacent thereto.
 - F. THE ENDOCRINE SYSTEM
- G. THE TOTAL MANAGEMENT OF TRAUMA, including musculosketal, hand and head injuries. The responsibility for all phases of care of the injured patient is an essential component of general surgery.
- 3. ADEQUATE EMPLOYMENT OF ENDOSCOPIC TECHNIQUES, PARTICULARLY RIGID PROCTOSIGMOIDOSCOPY AND OPERATIVE CHOLEDOCHOSCOPY. In addition, the general surgeon must be familiar with a variety of endoscopic techniques such as laryngoscopy, bronchoscopy, esophagoscopy, gastroscopy, colonoscopy and peritoneoscopy.

4. ADDITIONALLY AS SECONDARY COMPONENTS, the general surgeon is expected to possess understanding of the principles of and to have acquired a personal clinical experience, to include operative care, in the more common problems in thoracic, cardiac, gynecologic, neurologic, orthopaedic, plastic, neonatal and urologic surgery and anesthesiology. Appropriate clinical experience in the special disciplines enumerated in the preceding sentence should be acquired by a formal rotation on a separately constituted service, or by having been the operating surgeon or first assistant surgeon on an acceptable number and variety of cases.
