The L.S.U. Eye Center

The L.S.U. Eye Center, which houses the Department of Ophthalmology of the Louisiana State University Medical Center School of Medicine in New Orleans, opened its doors in January of 1978. The Center is located in a 4-story, 45,000 square-foot building, in which it occupies the second, third and fourth floors, divided among teaching, patient care and research.

Second Floor: Out-patient clinics, teaching library,

conference rooms

Third Floor: Diagnostic center, (photography, ultrasonography, retinal function studies),

department library, administrative

offices

Fourth Floor: Lions' Eye Research Laboratories, sur-

gical teaching rooms

The L.S.U. Eye Center is supported by state funding and federal grants. The State of Louisiana furnished and equipped the clinical areas of the Center, while much of the original laboratory equipment was provided through a grant from the Lions International Clubs of Louisiana. The Lions Clubs have also generously supported the on-going programs of ophthalmic research.

The Center has a full-time faculty of 11 medical and research scientists, and a part-time clinical faculty numbering 20. There are also 35 support personnel and 17 residents and fellows.

Referred patients are seen in the out-patient clinics at the Eye Center. The teaching program is affiliated with Charity Hospital and the newly-equipped Eye and Ear Institute of Louisiana, where surgery and in-patient care are situated.

Research scientists at the L.S.U. Eye Center utilize the extensive animal care facilities of the L.S.U. Medical Center. Primate colonies are also available at the Delta Regional Primate Center in Covington, Louisiana.


