Desmond Schatz, MD, is Interim Chair, UF College of Medicine Department of Pediatrics; Interim Physician-in-chief, UF Health Shands Children's Hospital; Medical Director of the Diabetes Center and Associate Director of the GCRC at the University of Florida, Gainesville. He is a physician-scientist and is the

Principal Investigator (PI) on multiple funded peer reviewed grants from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF). He is also the inventor of three patents.

Dr. Schatz earned his medical degree at the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg before completing his pediatric residency at the University of Florida. He then completed additional training with an Endocrinology fellowship, also at University of Florida.

In 1922, Leonard Thompson, a 14-year-old boy, was the first patient to be treated for diabetes using insulin. **This special Grand Rounds celebrates the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first clinical use of insulin to treat diabetes.**  Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Define endotypes and need to identify heterogeneity of Type 1 Diabetes
- Discuss important effect of age in disease process
- Describe efforts aimed at interdicting Type 1 Diabetes with a goal of personalizing therapies

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
