Dr. Lolie Yu Named Vice Chair for Clinical Research for the LSU Department of Pediatrics



Join me in congratulating Lolie Yu, MD for her many accomplishments in the Department of Pediatrics and her new role as Vice Chair for Clinical Research.

Lolie stepped down as Section Head of Pediatric Hematology-Oncology for the Department in mid-April and will assume her new role on May 1, 2022.

Dr. Yu has been a faculty member at LSU since 1987 when she began as an Instructor in the Department of Pediatrics. In her 35 years at LSU and Children's Hospital, Lolie has quite literally built the Section of

Pediatric Hematology and Oncology. She has been a Professor of Pediatrics with Tenure for 20 years and served as Section Head since 2007. Lolie has been the true triple threat manifesting excellence in clinical care, education, and research. She has over eighty peer reviewed publications, has held grant funding for decades, has served on most University and Hospital committees, and led breakthroughs in childhood cancer and bone marrow transplantation which have impacted hundreds of Louisiana children over the last 3 decades. She has built the only Pediatric Bone Marrow Transplant program in the State and has led our Children's Oncology Group programs to excellence and preeminence in the State over the last 20 years.

Lolie now will assume the role of Vice Chair of Clinical Research in the LSU

Department of Pediatric. She has also recently been named as Pediatrics' first member to the School of Medicine Appointments and Promotions Committee.

In her new roles, Dr. Yu will be able to leverage her extensive knowledge and experience to the benefit of our Department's research, advocacy, and faculty development missions.

Join me in congratulating Lolie for her new roles and thanking Lolie for her 35 years of service to the Department and the University. The best is yet to come.

International Travel Update from Dr. Taylor

As we all know, submissions for international travel opened this month with a new policy in place. Ten packets were submitted this month but only two met criteria for review by the committee. Among others, the most common issues were submission of abstracts, accepting invitations to speak, purchasing airline tickets, organizing meetings, etc. before approval by the international travel committee.

However, because April was the first month for travel packet submission, we will accept and forward them all to the International Travel Committee for consideration. Normally they would have been returned without referral to the committee.

Beginning May 2022, the new international travel policy will be adhered to. If your packet does not meet policy requirements, please do not submit it as it will be returned without review by the international travel committee. Given that abstracts and acceptance of speaking invitations are usually due months before the meeting takes place, any packets we review in May should be for meetings in the late summer or fall at the earliest.

UCSF's Stad Center for Pediatric Pain, Palliative and Integrative Medicine Global Lecture Series hosts Joan Marston, RN as their next speaker on Thursday, May 5th, 2022 - at 11:00am CST. The title of her talk is "Delivering Pediatric Palliative Care During Humanitarian Crises."

The unprovoked Russian war on Ukrainian civilians has left hundreds of children killed and millions displaced, including many children with serious illness. As more and more evidence is coming to light raising serious accusations of Russian atrocities and war crimes (including shelling of hospitals, sexual violence, and willful killing of civilians), next month's lecture addresses providing care for children with serious illness in humanitarian crises all over the world.

She will be joined for this plenary by **Olena Riga, MD** (Professor at Kharkiv National Medical University, Neonatology & Pediatric Neurology, Ukraine) and **Andrey Penkov, MD** (Head physician, Outpatient Pediatric Clinic, Kharkiv, Ukraine), who have been providing pediatric palliative care for many years in the 2nd largest city Kharkiv (1.8 million people, 20miles/30km from the Russian border)

These two extraordinary Ukrainians physicians, trained by EPEC-Pediatrics, will plan join us live from Ukraine (we also will also pre-record their contributions, as the war is going on, to prepare for this event).

Benjamin Danielson, MD, is a clinical professor of Pediatrics at the University of Washington. For two decades he was the medical director at the Odessa Brown Children's Clinic which serves mostly low-income families in an historically Black community. He resigned in late 2020 in protest of racism

and related dysfunctions at the clinic's overseeing entity: Seattle Children's Hospital.

He also serves on various boards of health-related organizations, philanthropic organizations, and community groups dedicated to health issues. He chairs the Governor's Interagency Council on Health Disparities, cochaired the Governor's Task Force on creating an Office of Equity, chairs the Group Health Foundation Board, and cochairs King County's Racism Is A Public Health Crisis Team. He has been on many boards and currently serves in this capacity on the Seattle YWCA, the Seattle Foundation, Center for Children and Youth Justice, and Amara. He has been active in the public health and healthcare governance realm. Dr. Danielson earned his medical degree at the University of Washington School of Medicine. He completed his Pediatric internship and residency at Seattle Children's Hospital
