PEDI 420 – Elective Ambulatory Pediatrics – Tiger Care Clinic/Adolescent Medicine

o Students will rotate in LSU's main primary care Pediatric clinic, Tiger Care, for 2 weeks and in outpatient adolescent medicine focused clinics for 2 weeks. At Tiger Care, they will be exposed to a variety of patient visits including health maintenance exams for babies, children and adolescents as well as common pediatric problems that present to the ambulatory setting. Students are expected to see patients independently, develop history taking and physical exam skills, present patient assessments and management plans to faculty, and document their findings in the EHR. Rotating students are expected to attend resident conferences during this rotation. During adolescent medicine specialty and primary care clinics, students will experience working with patients in-person and virtually. Individual projects and assignments from appropriate adolescent health resources are also integral parts of this elective. Faculty members will evaluate student performance based on participation, knowledge, interest, clinical skills, and projects.
