She is a co-director of a perinatal palliative care program at Northwestern Memorial Hospital and serves as in interim section head of Pediatric Palliative Care.

Priya Rajan, MD, earned her medical degree from the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill. Following her Obstetrics and Gynecology Residency at UC Irvine, Dr. Rajan completed a Fellowship in Maternal-Fetal Medicine, also at UC Irvine. Dr. Rajan currently serves as an Associate Professor in the Division of Maternal-Fetal Medicine at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. She is also the Section Chief of Diagnostic Ob-Gyn Ultrasound at Northwestern Medical.
