News from the Division of Hematology/Oncology



Sheldon L. Kaplan, MD, earned his medical degree from the University of Missouri School of Medicine. He then completed his Pediatric Residency and Pediatric Infectious Disease Fellowship training at St. Louis Children's Hospital and Washington University School of Medicine.

He then moved to Texas and joined the faculty at Baylor College of Medicine and Texas Children's. He has earned numerous awards in recognition of his teaching and excellence as a physician, including the European Society for Paediatric Infectious Diseases Distinguished Award for Education and the Distinguished Physician Award for the Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society. Dr. Kaplan is a prolific researcher, focusing on infections in children caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae and Staphylococcus aureus. His research also evaluates new antibiotics for children with infections caused by antibiotic resistant bacteria.



Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Know how the routine administration of pneumococcal vaccines to children in the United States has resulted in declines in invasive and local pneumococcal disease in children
- Be familiar with the studies assessing "replacement pneumococcal seratypes" as well as other streptococci that may be on the increase causing infections in children as PCV seratype disease decreases in children
- Be aware of the expanded serotype coverage associated with newer PCVs close to licensure.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
