

#### **LSUHSC Update: COVID Masking**

Effective Monday June 27th, masks will be optional in non-clinical administrative areas on campus.

- In all clinical areas, masks will be required.
- In student group laboratory settings, masks are required.
- In other small group settings, masks are highly advised, and mandatory masking may be instituted by course directors.

When having meetings or gatherings, please be sensitive to others around you - ask if anyone would prefer masking and if so, please accommodate.

We have reached this point as a result of the collaborative efforts we have taken together. The numbers of tests being performed and incidents in campus have been very low over the last several weeks. In the City of New Orleans, testing is also at very low numbers and the curve of cases appears on the decline. Serious illness (hospitalizations and ICU admissions) also are at very low levels.

As always, we will continue to watch the data points continuously. Conditions may change, and we will respond accordingly as needed.
