Research in Academic Pediatrics Initiative on Diversity (RAPID)

RAPID is celebrating 10 years with new funding opportunities for fellows and junior faculty who identify as underrepresented in medicine (UIM), disabled, or from a socially, culturally, economically or disadvantaged background, and who are committed to a career in academic pediatrics.

RAPID Scholar Award Funding Paths:

- RAPID-NIDDK: \$15,000 per award to support projects focused on NIDDK research priorities, including nutrition, obesity, and sickle cell disease (funded by NIDDK R25DK096944)
- RAPID-PIDS: \$15,000 per award to support projects focused on pediatric infectious diseases (funded by the Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society)
- RAPID-APS: \$15,000 per award to support projects focused on a wide range of pediatric clinical research domains (funded by the American Pediatric Society)
- RAPID-ABP: \$15,000 per award to support projects focused on a wide range of pediatric clinical research domains (funded by the American Board of Pediatrics Foundation)

Toni Gross, MD, MPH, FAAP, is a Children's Hospital Emergency Medicine doctor and Chief of the Emergency Department at Children's Hospital New Orleans. Originally from Baton Rouge, Dr. Gross received her training at Eastern Virginia Medical School in Norfolk, Virginia and completed her pediatric residency at LSU Health New Orleans and Children's Hospital. She was a fellow at Northwestern University, Feinberg School of Medicine and trained at Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago. Prior to joining Children's Hospital Dr. Gross served on the Board of Governors with the Arizona EMS, then worked as an attending physician in the Emergency Department at Phoenix Children's Hospital.
