
- Orleans Parish Infant Team started in May 1998 in two sections of Orleans Parish
 Juvenile Dependency Court (Section A & D) seeing children birth through 5 years that
 were placed in foster care
- Orleans Parish Baby Court Team started in June 2007 in one section of Orleans Parish Juvenile Dependency Court (Section A) seeing children birth to 3 years
 - Court team involves:
 - LSUHSC Infant Team
 - Child Protection Workers and Supervisors
 - BGC Attorney for Child Protection
 - Parent's Attornevs
 - Children's Attorneys
 - CASA Workers
- Since the start of the LSUHSC Infant Team we have seen 289 children
 - As of April 2014, 266 children's cases have been closed
 - o As of April 2014, 23 children's cases remain open in Orleans Parish
 - We have recently begun seeing children in St. Bernard Parish and currently have 3 children's cases open

Child Ages at Date of Referral




Mother's Ages at Date of Referral

Court Team Outcomes

	Prior to Court Team <i>N</i> =53	After Court Team <i>N</i> =60
Reunification with biological parent(s)	32.0%	38.3%
Transfer to relative care or adoption by relative	34.0%	35.0%
Adoption by non-relative caregiver	34.0%	26.7%

Time to Permanency

- Prior to Court Team, mean time to permanency in Section A was 17.91 months and Section D was 15.14 months
- After Court Team was implemented in Section A, mean time to permanency in Section A was 10.37 months
- After permanency, only 5 children since 1998 have re-entered care

Why Court Team Makes A Difference:

- Monthly court hearings
- Increased visitation between parent and child
- Support of the biological parents
- Increased focus on identifying relative caregivers
- Dual permanency plan (decrease number of placements and increase permanency)
