Currently working to integrate electronic medical record system in order to increase level of immersion for the simulation.

Clinical Service:

In-patient service activities: I spent 3 half days and 2 full days a week providing dedicated coverage and resident supervision of the consultation liaison service at University Medical Center. This involves treating a wide variety of psychiatric conditions in the acute medical setting. In addition to direct patient care a significant portion of this time is also providing liaison services to help educate the primary team as well and foster therapeutic alliances between patients and their treatment teams. I also provide electroconvulsive treatment coverage every other week. This typically entails treating both inpatient and outpatients three days a week at University Medical Center. However due to the limited access to this treatment on weeks that I am on service I am on-call for any emergent cases that arise.

Clinic coverage: I provide psychiatric services in the multidisciplinary HIV clinic approximate one-half day a week. During this time, I assess patients for psychiatric comorbidities and help tailor effective treatments with a goal of minimizing impact in regard to the patient's complex medication regimens. For appropriate patients Suboxone mediated assisted treatment is also provided with close clinical monitoring. I also provide resident supervision for integrated psychiatric services in the LSUHSC high risk obstetrics clinic at University Medical Center. I spent two other half days a week providing psychiatric services in a general psychiatric clinic. During these half days I also spend a portion of my time providing supervision for PGY-3 residents in the general psychiatric clinic.

Call: I am on overnight call for the hospital services at University Medical Center approximately twice a month. Once a month I am on call for two weekend days to supervise the residents who are seeing patients in the inpatient psychiatric units, behavioral health emergency room extension, and consultation liaison service.
