Louisiana State University Health Science Center - New Orleans (LSUHSC-NO) and the Louisiana Department of Health/Office of Behavioral Health are seeking applicants to participate in the Louisiana State Opioid Response (LaSOR) grant, to offer Medication Assisted Treatment Services. To be considered as a LaSOR Office Based Opioid Treatment (OBOT) Provider within LaSOR Hub and Spoke Model, **an applicant must complete this application in its entirety, be a DATA Waivered Physician or Clinician and accept patients that are under/uninsured or Medicaid eligible to be considered for this project.** Each application will be reviewed by LSUHSC-NO and LDH/OBH. If you are selected as an OBOT/Spoke within the LaSOR model, you will receive a letter of acceptance and contract to execute formal partnership for participation.

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**\* Note: As the State of Louisiana strives to address the opioid epidemic by increasing access to MAT services, LDH is working to streamline the Medicaid enrollment process. Starting in Summer 2019, the new process will provide for a single application and credentialing process with Medicaid to reduce the complexity of enrollment, which will eliminate the need to enroll and credential with each MCO individually. However, providers will still need to execute contracts with each MCO for reimbursement. Therefore, as a LaSOR partner, the State of Louisiana recommends enrolling as a Medicaid provider using the single statewide enrollment process starting later this year to ensure sustainability of MAT services after the LaSOR projects ends in 2020.**
