**Clinical Service:**

**Mental and Behavioral Health Capacity Project (2012 – current) - Coordinate behavioral health outreach services to public schools in Lafourche and Terrebonne Parishes. Provide direct services in Oaklawn Junior High School including case consultation with the school counselor, therapeutic services for students, behavioral health screening for the entire school and offer trainings as needed for teachers, parents and staff. Coordinate and provide supportive consultation and training in behavioral health research and techniques for school counselors in both Lafourche and Terrebonne parishes through coordination with each parish’s School District.**

**VAYLA (Vietnamese American Young Leaders Association) Clinic – (2012-current)** Developed a mental health clinic embedded in a social service outreach program serving youth in New Orleans East. Provide therapy to youth, co-led a Leadership Program with local youth and provide ongoing psychoeducational trainings to youth and VAYLA staff. Lead Mindfulness Skills groups for the staff of VAYLA.

**Orleans Parish Infant Team (2001 – current)** – A parish-wide program working with children aged 5 years old and younger in Foster Care. Assist the Office of Community Services (OCS) Foster Care and the Orleans Parish Juvenile Court by performing assessments of all caregiver-child relationships and providing services to assist in reunification of the family where possible. Carry a minimum of 3-5 foster care cases, each involving 1-4 children and any number of parents and caregivers. Perform clinical assessments on all potential caregivers for each child, provide outpatient weekly therapy for the children and caregivers as indicated, must produce quarterly reports and any requested interim reports for the Orleans Parish Department of Children and Family Services Foster Care division and the Orleans Parish Juvenile Court, must be available to testify at court hearings related to each case or to provide letters with recommendations related to the case on request from DCFS. Provide several trainings annually to the DCFS Foster Care and Family Services staff. Assist in running Family Service Parenting groups as needed.

**Orleans Parish Court Team (2007-current)** – Provide relationship based assessments to children aged 0-3 years who are in the foster care system and their caregivers referred by Orleans Parish DCFS. Provide any recommended dyadic and individual therapy, and referral to any needed adjunctive resources including Early Steps, psychiatric assessment and treatment and psychological testing. Attend monthly staffings and produce monthly court letters outlining work done on each case. Provide court testimony as needed. Coordinate and collaborate with other service providers including DCFS, and CASA.

**Victim's Assistance Program (2006-2012)** – provides direct services to traumatized children (aged 0-17) and their families, living in Orleans Parish. Individual therapy, crisis intervention, outreach and professional and paraprofessional training provided. Assist in production of public education materials. On call service 1 week per month.

**Violence Intervention Program (2001-2006)**– A parish-wide program that provides direct services to children and their families affected by violence, provides education to first responders, the public and to other mental health professionals. Carry a minimum of 6 weekly outpatient clients, am on call for immediate response to crime scenes (e.g., school shootings, domestic violence calls where children were present) to provide direct crisis services, provide quarterly trainings to NOPD precinct officers, offer a minimum of 3 outside trainings per year to professional and paraprofessional audiences, do several media appearances per year to discuss effects of violence on children, attend annual meetings related to the grant

renewal, on 24 hour call service 1 week per month. Assist in writing educational materials for public outreach and education.

**First Responder Support Program (2005- 2011) – Program Coordinator – A parish wide outreach to Orleans Parish first responders in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. Clinical assessment and services provided to first responders and their families.**

**Learning Community: Psychological First Aid (2009 – 2010) – participating in meetings, phone conferences and trainings. One of 9 applicants selected from 30 nationally to be placed on the Train the Trainer track.**

**Orleans Parish School Outreach (2005-2012)– A parish-wide program offered to all schools. Services provided include teacher and parent trainings, assessment, group and individual treatment. Served as a consultant to school staff/faculty. Provided direct services to McDonough City Park Academy students, annual behavioral health screenings for all students and any requested behavioral health trainings for students, parents and school staff for 3 years.**

**St. Bernard Project Mental Health and Wellness Clinic (2009-2012) – Program Coordinator and Clinician – Provides mental health services to residents of St. Bernard Parish.**

**Day Treatment (2006-2007) – Provided therapeutic support services to behavior-disordered children in St. John Parish.**

**Cops for Kids Camp (2005 – 2008) – Program Coordinator– Provides mental health intervention to children aged 7-14 attending the New Orleans Police and Justice Foundation’s 8-week summer camp. Coordinate a staff of 11 psychologists, social workers, interns and research associates.**

**Tzu Chi/LSU Mental Health Clinic at FEMA’s Welcome Center (2006-2007) – Program Coordinator – Offers mental health services to all citizens returning to New Orleans post-Katrina who require immediate assessment, treatment and referral to local resources.**

**Private Practice (2004- 2013) – Provided assessment and outpatient therapy services to a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 8 clients referred by the Office of Community Services (OCS.) Specialized in trauma, grief, sexual abuse, and parent-child relationship issues. Provided quarterly written reports and any update letters requested by OCS. Was available to testify at any court hearings related to the case as requested by OCS. Was also required to attend meetings with collateral resources associated with the case (e.g., school, pediatrician, etc.) as needed.**

**Tiger Care Pediatric Clinic weekly coverage (2004-2005) – Provide mental health triage and referral services to all cases referred by the pediatricians. Attend clinic biweekly for 3 hours per clinic.**

**Early Trauma Treatment Network (2003-2005) – A national research protocol focused on treatment of trauma in children 0-5 years old. Carry a minimum of 3 weekly outpatient cases, providing therapy to the child(ren) and their caregiver, consultation at the child’s school and any related reporting to other agencies (Child Protection, police, attorneys.)**
