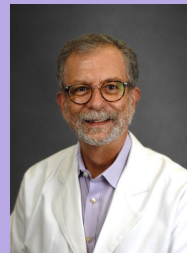

Great job, Dr. Augustus-Wallace!



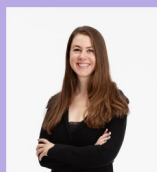
