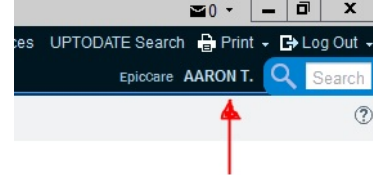

Information Services - Epic Issue

CH IT has just discovered that Tap&Go or tapping F4 is not always logging people out of Epic on their computer. Please make sure when you first sign into

Epic that your name is displayed in the upper right corner.



The issue is only occurring on computers with a Tap&Go running Citrix which is mainly at Children's and associated clinics. If you are using your own desktop or laptop computer this will not affect you. The IT team is currently working on fixing this and I will send out another email when the issue is corrected.
