Recent Scholarly Activity from the Division of Endocrinology

Several members of the Division of Endocrinology presented their research at the American Diabetes Association's annual meeting here in New Orleans this past weekend. The research poster titled *African-American Youth and Parent Perspectives on Advanced Technologies in Diabetes Management: Closing the Loop on Health Disparities* also included researchers from the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine. Authors included Alan M. Delameter, Elizabeth R. Pulgaron, Gabriela Guevara, Sonja A. Washington, Diane Z. Franz, Ricardo Gomez, Dania Felipe, Jayalakshmi Narayan Bhat, and Stuart

Chalew. Their poster was selected as a recipient of the National Health Disparities Committee's Top 10 Recommended Abstract. These posters detail research that helps us understand factors underlying diabetes disparities and inequities or demonstrates practical interventions that may contribute to eliminating them. Drs. She earned her medical degree from Ross University Medical School, then moved to Chicago to complete her Pediatric residency training at the University of Illinois. She furthered her training in Pediatric Pulmonology with a fellowship at Tulane University and the Medical College of Wisconsin. In 2007, Dr. Drewek joined the faculty of Phoenix Children's Hospital in Arizona in the Division of Pediatric Pulmonology. Dr. Drewek founded and currently serves as the medical director of the Sleep Disorders Program. Most recently, she has joined the CHNOLA team as the Medical Director of the Sleep Lab.
